To be eligible, applicants must own and live in a single-family home zoned for residential use located within the Boston Target Area for six months prior to applying. Owners of mobile homes are not eligible unless they own the lot and the mobile home. Gross family income cannot exceed the following limits.

Applicants will be rated by demographics (up to 7 points based on income, age of head of household and disability status) and the condition of the house (up to 22 points). Applicants with the most points will be ranked highest. For tie scores, lowest income adjusted for household size will be addressed first.
